 How strange it is that a person would dare not touch the ball with his hand in the penalty area for fear of the referee penalising him, but he dares to venture into touching that which Allah has prohibited

And Allah will save those who feared Him by their attainment; no evil will touch them, nor will they grieve. (39:61)

- How strange it is that a person on the football field is so cautious not to be caught off side, but does not care if Allah catches him in the wrong place.
- How strange it is that when a free kick of the opposing team is so dangerously
 placed that it is a threat to the goals, players rally together to form a line of
 defence, while we do not think of standing together to protect our Deen.

"Indeed Allah loves those who fight in His Cause, in rows as if they are a solid structure."(61:4)

• How strange it is that we would do whatever it takes to be like our sporting heroes in terms of dress code, hairstyle and external appearances, to show our identity and loyalty; but there is nothing in us to show that we are the followers of the Greatest Nabi Muhammad ...

- How strange it is that a person fears the yellow warning card of the referee but fails to respond to the yellow cards of Allah, in the form of trials and tribulations; sickness, financial loss, narrow escape from an accident...
- How strange it is that we are fear the red card of the referee which would suspend or expel you from the game, but totally unconcerned about those actions that would expel us out from Jannah for ever.

How strange it is that after the final whistle is blown, the game is over, there is no re-play. But the same person fails to understand that when the final whistle for his life is blown there is no second chance, no re-play.

 How strange it is that a play would never think of harming his own team by scoring an own goal, but thinks nothing about harming his own Deen.

- How strange is that a player is concerned about the millions of people around the world watching him in action but he seems to be untroubled about the day when every deed will be played out in front of mankind on Qiyaamah.
- Sometimes a person is at the mouth of the goals but fails to put the ball at the back of the net. "He missed a sitter", "He missed a golden opportunity"
- How often has Allah 12 presented us with golden opportunities to gain nearness to Him by looking after our parents, assist the needy, perform Salaah, give charity, keep Fasts, turn to him in repentance...
- Shaytaan is playing a more dangerous game with us. He is sure to sit on our path tackling and defending so we do not reach our goal. Shaytaan will continue to try to snatch away our Imaan until the final throes of death. Our defences have to be on full alert at all times.
